The current holder of this trophy is Te Kapa Haka o Ngāti Whakaue. This trophy was donated in 1972 by Ngāti Poneke who were at the forefront of Māori Performing Arts, especially in this category. The group had won the Wellington and Ikaroa district competitions and performed at festivals in Tauranga, Ngāruawahia, and the Hui Aranga. Ngāti Poneke has the distinction of being the trophy's first winner.
